Industry Happenings

The food industry is always evolving. Here are some highlights from the last few months:

- Amazon acquires Whole Foods
 - Amazon recently announced the acquisition of Whole Foods. This acquisition will allow Amazon to break into the brick-and-mortar space pending regulatory approvals. Analysts are going back and forth on how much impact this acquisition will have on traditional retail grocers.
- US Organic Food Sales Top \$43 million in 2016
 - Organic food sales in 2016 reached \$43 million which is a sales increase of 8.4% over previous year. The organic food market now accounts for 5.3% of total food sales in the US with fruit and vegetables being the largest group of organic foods.
- Recall of granola & protein bars due to *Listeria* contamination the week of June 12th
 - A number of companies are recalling granola and protein bar products across the US due to a potentially contaminated ingredient from an outside supplier.

April Executive Meeting Minutes

February 17th, 2017 via phone at 10:00 a.m.

The February meeting of the IA Section IFT executive council was called to order at 10:02 a.m. by Shaw via phone call.

1. Past President Report: Bailey is working on the Supplier's Night for November 2017. FFA center is likely not going to be an option anymore due to the lack of responsiveness from the venue. Any ideas on other venues should be sent to Bailey. Venue needs to be under \$2,000 to rent. Some potential ideas were the new Kemin headquarters, Hy-Vee event space in West Des Moines.

2. President Report: The transition meeting is scheduled for May 18th from 4—6 pm at Prairie Canary Restaurant & Bar in Grinnell, Iowa. The expectation is that all changing positions will provide guidance to the incoming person prior to the transition meeting.

The Section Leadership Forum 2017 will take place again during IFT at the Venetian / Sands on June 25th from 2:30—5:00 pm. Van Thomme will be attending on behalf of IAIFT. Other potential attendees could be Coleman, Russo, Erickson or Lee—will follow up with these individuals.

IFT Outstanding Volunteer nominees are due on May 15th. Email suggestions to Shaw.

The Section Lecture Series speaker portal has expanded. Have to apply by July 31st, 2017 if we want to bring in someone next year. Cost is \$1,100 to offset the speaker honorarium and travel costs. There are 66 various topics we can choose from. Board to review topics and make any suggestions in May meeting.

The 2017 IFT Feeding Tomorrow Fun Run + Fitness is having a challenge with all the sections this year. It is \$30 per person to participate. Should the section recruit 40 participants, we have the option of receiving a travel grant for IFT18 for a student. We will donate \$100 to the fun run again. More details to come—Shaw to follow up.

The 2017 section membership challenges ends on May 31st, 2017 and the reward is \$500 for the section to use.

3. President Elect Report: The April 20th meeting did not have a great turn out—mainly board members, students and 2 industry professionals. A total of 17 people. Discussion on moving the date up a week next year due to finals schedules.

For summer 2017 we are looking at doing another social—potentially Jasper Winery summer concert series or a bike and brewery tour around the Des Moines area or going to Gray's Lake. Final decision to be made at May meeting. September 17 we will be going to a farm that has a nursery and finisher site. November 9th will be the supplier's night and student night. Bailey will lead this event. December 7th or 8th will be our holiday social where we will have our first annual toy drive for Blank Children's Hospital in Des Moines. Shaw is working on hospital selection and culinary adventure (Iowa City event). We will have at a bar / dive place that has an area we can all hang out in. Very casual setting and likely an ugly sweater contest. The section will buy dinner for every attendee that donates a gift valued at \$25 or more. Dinner includes 2 bar beverages and appetizers served during cocktail hour. Will be from 5—8 with cocktail hour from 5—6. Door prizes included as well. Location is needed for the February 15th event. April 12th will be in Dubuque at Clark University.

4. Treasurer Report: Current balance is \$18,469.87. There are no outstanding balances. For our expenses we are okay on that and dinner meetings, we are over for scholarships. No program speakers or supplier night expenses for this year yet. Will do \$100 donation for the fun run. Coleman to follow up on filing taxes.

5. Food Science Club Report: The food science club put together a panel on graduate school that had current graduate students, those who had applied and faculty for applying and experience to give undergrads an idea of what to expect. A demonstration was given to the local 4H program on how to make ice cream. Award were given to graduating seniors. Spring break consisted of a tour of Wisconsin companies. They had positive feedback on this. The college bowl team took 3rd place overall at their competition.

6. Secretary Report: Working on getting testimonials for the website. No other updates.
