Industry Happenings

The food industry is always evolving. Here are some highlights from the last few months:

- Study finds that consumers are willing to pay more for 'all-natural' labeled foods
 - A study published in the *Journal of Food Science* found that expectations of product quality, nutritional content, and the amount of money consumers were willing to pay increase when consumers see products labeled "all-natural" compared to products without the label.
- AAK opened its first of three US innovation centers
 - AAK opened the doors to its AAKITON Lab, an innovation center on-site at the company's US headquarters in Edison, NJ in late February. This new facility is dedicated to bakery and chocolate / confectionary labs.
- Researchers find RNA molecules may prevent fungus in food crops
 - Researchers at the University of Arizona found that small interfering RNA molecules can be used to silence fungus development in corn.

February Executive Meeting Minutes

February 13th, 2017 via phone at 12:00 p.m.

The February meeting of the IA Section IFT executive council was called to order at 12:03 p.m. by Shaw via phone call.

1. Past President Report: Bailey's project for the year is the supplier's night for 2017—2018. She is working with FFA in Ankeny to host the event. There would be access to a kitchen for culinary challenge and room for about 50 booths. Appears the November date is open for the location. Bailey will have more details soon.

2. President Report: The theme for the year is membership. IFT has a challenge for \$500 that we could use to emphasize membership. Elections are coming up. We have one candidate for President Elect—Weigel and three candidates for Member-at-Large. We need to promote this more on social media and send out the candidate bios. We will discuss at the Happy Hour on Thursday.

3. President Elect Report: For the February meeting everything is squared away. Bailey and Weigel will pick up the food and Weigel will pay for it on behalf of Aerotek. To date we have 37 people registered—3 from Kemin, Sethness, lots of Iowa State, 2 from UL, and all election candidates are registered. Sethness will speak first. We will plan to start around 5:30. The Genesys guy can no longer come so he will likely have to WebEx in. We have speakers so we should be good to go for that. Shaw will bring a projector.

April meeting is still a work in progress. We will likely go to GPC and have a tour of the solution center and pilot plant. Potentially doing sensory in the QC lab as well. Details are still being worked out.

For the September meeting we are work with the lady from Clark University in Dubuque to coordinate. Brennhamen Pork is flexible on a date so it would be better to go there another time in 2018—potentially for April next year.

Looking at the summer 2017, the ICubs game was a lot of fun last year so looking to do something similar. One suggestion was going to Jasper Winery for their summer concert series and having it be potluck style. Ideally avoid Friday's and weekends due to busy summer schedules.

For November 2017, Bailey is working on the suppliers night. For December 2017 Shaw is working on hospital selection and culinary adventure (Iowa City event).

4. Treasurer Report: Current balance is \$18,163.87. There are no outstanding transactions. There will be a check issued for the social club on Thursday. Still a little unclear if we fall under a 501-C 3 or 6. It is likely a C-3 status based on Linda's last tax filing. Bailey has the tax ID and section report. Social club will cost \$160. Looking at the budget, we were positive \$30 from the November meeting, but will be down \$130 after the February meeting.

5. Food Science Club Report: Food science club had Fudgemania where they sold 120 lbs of fudge. They are going on a club trip to Madison in March. The college bowl team is going to IFTSA in April at the University of Minnesota.

6. Secretary Report: We have been making a push to get the website updated. Many pages have been built out, but there is still a long way to go. Would like to get some new testimonials from members that we can use on the website. Homepage also needs to be updated. Gent to check on if we are limited to a set number of pages on the website display as would like to add a contact tab. We will also need to update the membership pricing model on the website if it is approved during elections.

Pictures from the November event need to be uploaded to Facebook as well.

For the February happy hour we had talked about doing a mailer; however time constraints did not allow. Therefore a digital mailer was sent to all members in the Des Moines area. We used a website called Paperless Post for the invites. Cost was \$24 to create and send about 75 invites. Feedback seems positive so far. We may want to consider using on a larger scale in the future.
