STATEMENT OF ASSETS, RESERVES AND NET WORTH

The Statement of Assets, Reserves and Net Worth is arranged in two columns. On the left side are the Assets, which usually consist of: 1) your Checking account balance, 2) a savings account balance and/or stocks and bonds or other short or long term investments, usually listed at cost, and 3) physical assets i.e. any property you own such as projectors, banners, badge makers, etc.

On the right side are listed the Reserves and Net Worth, the total of which must equal the total of all the Assets in the left column. **If your section has no reserves, then all the assets constitute net worth.** If, however, you have earmarked funds for scholarships, awards, etc. then these funds should be reflected by setting up a reserve in this amount and reducing the net worth by the same amount so the total of the reserves and net worth still equals the total assets. Some sections have established such funds in a separate savings or investment account, in which case the fund should show not only as a reserve on the right side, but also as a separate savings account asset on the left side.

Reservations for dinner meetings of the Iowa Section IFT are to be mailed or faxed to the person(s) indicated on the reservation form by the date indicated on the reservation form. For prepaid reservations, please be sure to mail the check early enough so that it is received before the date indicated. All checks should be made payable to the Iowa Section IFT. Normally, we are required to provide the restaurant with a confirmed plate count 48 hours prior to the event. Reservations will only be made for persons who have made their payment prior to that time. **Persons who have submitted reservations and not prepaid, may attend the meeting and be served if food is available. They will be charged an additional \$5 at the door.**

Students who are members of the Iowa Section IFT can make prepaid reservations at a cost of \$10 per meal. Students who have not pre-registered and prepaid will pay \$15 at the door if food is available.
